

Article 15: You Are All-Knowing,

...or didn't you know that?

In your life, you are omniscient, ...you have infinite awareness, understanding, and insight. You are all-knowing, ...fully knowledgeable about your self and life, but you don't believe this, ...if only because you believe that many things happen to you, or within you, that you are unaware of.

Has anything ever happened to you when you were not present? If so, where were you? Since you have always been present in your self and life, it is reasonable to declare that you were present for everything that has ever happened to you ...and will be equally present for future events and circumstances. But you'll probably claim that some things happen at a subconscious level that is below your knowing and understanding, ...so you cannot possibly know everything in your life. Maybe you are denying your knowing and understanding, ...but denial does not mean unknowing.

Years ago, Albert Einstein, explained his theory of relativity to an audience of Newtonian physicists who believed that the universe followed "fixed laws which could be discovered", ...so all things could be known and understood. In the middle of his presentation, Dr. Einstein was interrupted by a physicist who declared that to know anything in the universe, a scientist had to have at least one "fixed point of reference" by which to understand the universe. The man complained that in Einstein's relative universe, in which all things are in constant motion, nothing could ever be known with any certainty.

In response, Dr. Einstein told the man to pick any *fixed point he desired* ...and know all things relative to his chosen point, ...while other scientists would know everything relative to the *fixed points they desired*; ...then, each scientist could know exactly what the others knew simply by comparing the relationship between the various *self-chosen fixed points*.

Assuming that Dr. Einstein was correct, if you are omniscient, if you are all-knowing about your universe, then there must be a single self-chosen point of reference which occurs in every belief, thought, attitude, emotion, word, action, event, circumstance, hope, sensation, and situation in your body and life. If this does not exist, then, of course, the physicist is correct ...and you cannot know anything about your self and life, ...so look carefully. What is that single point of reference in your lifeseif?

The answer, of course, is YOU, ...for you alone exist within everything in your life ...and you know and do all things only relative to self. For instance, if we tell you to live according to the Ten Commandments, you will only do that if you believe it is in *your best interest to do so*. You have always lived in this way ...and can live your life in no other way; ...you

make all choices relative to self, thus you are the self-chosen *fixed-point* in your universe. This is **selfness**, ...not selfishness. And though you believe you can and do make decisions to assist others at your own expense, ...in fact, those decisions, no matter their form or the individuals involved, are made to serve your awareful-self.

Being completely self-aware, **you always choose, with every belief/ thought/attitude/emotion/word/action, to serve yourself.** Ohh, certainly, at times, the consequences may seem not so wise or desirable, but when you made your choices, you selected and followed the ones you truly felt would serve you. If you ever choose to end your present life, you will do so because you feel that suicide is your best choice ...and that it will serve you. Choices are never made by accident or from ignorance of self, for **you are omniscient in your own life.**
